Fire Engine Returned to Hicksville Fire Department after 60 years

More than 60 years after Hicksville Volunteer Fire Department's fire engine was decommissioned, the vintage vehicle has returned home. A restoration committee has been set up to raise funds. We are asking neighbors, friends, history buffs, collectors, and people interested in seeing this truck come back to life to consider donating. It will be a labor of love and take hard work with multiple generations to save a piece of timeless history. The engine,

a 1948 Seagrave Pumper, responded at a critical point in the growth of the Hicksville Community. The pumper started production in March of 1948, and was completed in October the same year. In 1960, one of Hicksville's most disastrous fires at the Kantor Bros Tire Recapping Plant caused more than \$300,000 in damage and as a result, the Seagrave was damaged beyond repair and sold.
